
The Komagata Maru Affair: Contesting Imperial Politics of Indian Exclusion from Canada



Outstanding Features

In 1914, Gurdit Singh, a long-time resident of Serendah, Malaya chartered a Japanese ship, the *Komagata Maru*, to take 376 Punjabi passengers to Canada, a white dominion of the British Empire. Despite being British subjects of proven loyalty, the vast majority of passengers aboard the *Komagata Maru* were denied entry into Canada primarily due to racial discrimination and the fear of competition against white labour for unskilled jobs. Upon returning to India, 19 of the ship's passengers were killed by gunfire when they ignored the directive of British authorities to board a special train to the Punjab. This book provides an analytical account of the *Komagata Maru* affair situated in the wider context of British imperialism, global white supremacy agenda, diasporic revolutionary movement, and India's freedom struggle. It also sheds new light besides revising existing knowledge on the *Komagata Maru* affair and the Ghadar movement which are closely intertwined.
